32 Clients COC Permanent Supportive Housing 337 Case Management Hours In 2020, Scott Place housed a family of four: a single mother, her brother, her 8-year-old son and her mother. Both the brother and the mother had substance abuse issues. The family had trouble following rules, and seeking income, having multiple conflicts with staff because of the drug issues. Eventually, the family began understanding they had hit rock bottom and began seeking substance abuse rehabilitation options and participating in case management. In fall of 2020, Scott Place housed this family of 4, who now had income. The family exited the RRH program to self-sufficiency in early 2021.

Recently, the mother of this family approached the Shelter Manager in town and thanked him for all the help that Scott Place Shelter provided. She stated that her and her brother were clean and sober, and the family looked healthy. She said that for the first time in her life, she had money in her pocket and did not feel the threat of impending eviction. She spoke on her newfound religious faith, and mentioned Scott Place as the turning point for her family.



Weatherization



- WX DHHR & DOE \$1.2 million program funds, Completed 71 client jobs, Average Job Cost \$10,551
- Energy Auditors -Completed 81 audits for energy efficient savings.
- WX Utility Programs Installed 20 Energy Star certified refrigerators, 49 High Efficiency Heating System, 17 High Efficiency Hot Water Heaters, and provided energy education to 81 site dwellings.
- Dominion Hope \$12,688 program funds, 8 clients served. Installed 6 new High Efficiency Heating Systems
- Trailco \$57,996 program funds, 24 clients served by installing High Efficiency Heat Pumps, Energy Star appliances, or other services for conserving energy efficient savings.
- WX DHHR ECIP \$28,118 program funds, 12 clients served for heating emergencies.
- WX DHHR Electrical Upgrades \$26,300 program funds, 14 clients served for unsafe electrical systems for future weatherization services.
