- Awarded funding from the Affordable Housing Fund Program in the amount of \$10,000 to be used for a Capital Needs Assessment to assist with preservation planning of our affordable housing properties.
- Obtained partnership agreements to offer certified loan packaging to NCWVCAA clients for USDA Rural Development 502 Direct Mortgage loans and 504 Home Repair loans.

18 Clients COC Permanent Supportive Housing 332 Case Management Hours One of the nicer things about working at the Randolph County Homeless Shelter is seeing the progress that some of our clients display, and knowing that we played a major role in their life-style changes. This particular story demonstrates how support and security can affect the life of an individual.

Ms. Client, age 72 came to the Randolph County Homeless Shelter on March 22, 2022. She had been living in a house owned by family in Barbour County. She became homeless because of a disagreement with her brother.

Our first step was to make her feel comfortable in our homelike surroundings at the shelter. Shortly after entering shelter, she was faced with the suicidal death of her oldest son. She became very depressed and needed counseling to cope with this unexpected tragedy. Shelter staff arranged to get her therapy at our local mental health clinic. The second step was to try and assist with increasing her income. The only income Ms. client had was \$600 per month from Social Security. Case Management staff along with Ms. Client worked with Social Security, and due to her age she was able to get an increase in her monthly income from \$600 to \$840.00 per month.

The third phase of Ms. Client's story is that she was referred from Coordinated Intake to our Rapid Re-Housing Program. The Re-Housing Case Manager assisted Ms. Client, in applying for housing. Ms. Client was approved for subsidized housing, and only pays 30% of her monthly income for rent.

Ms. Client not only had increased her income, but she was exited from emergency shelter into permanent housing on June 23, 2022. On our last Repaid Re-housing home visit, Ms. client stated she loved her apartment, and is managing very well. She continues to tell us "The Shelter has helped me so much, I'm not sure what I would have done without your help".



### Weatherization



- WX DHHR & DOE \$1.2 million program funds, Completed 84 client jobs, Average Job Cost \$5,828
- ► Energy Auditors -Completed 112 energy & 84 quality control audits for energy efficient savings.
- WX Utility Programs Installed 29 Energy Star certified refrigerators, 42 high efficiency heating systems, 5 high efficiency hot water heaters, and provided energy education to 112 site dwellings.
- Dominion Hope \$7,618 program funds, 7 clients served. Installed 6 new High Efficiency Heating Systems
- Trailco \$52,434 program funds, 22 clients served by installing High Efficiency Heat Pumps, Energy Star appliances, or other services for conserving energy efficient savings.
- ▶ WX DHHR ECIP \$23,756 program funds, 7 clients served for heating emergencies.
- ▶ WX DHHR Electrical Upgrades \$11,131 program funds, 6 clients served for unsafe electrical systems for future weatherization services.
- WX ERRP \$118,106 program funds, 19 clients served for emergency heating/and or cooling repair or replacements.
